





## **BEST IN THE INDIAN OCEAN**

## STRENGTHENING GLOBAL CONSERVATION


Positioned around Madagascar, the four European Overseas entities of the Indian Ocean have specific characteristics and form a very mixed area with various biodiversity challenges. The two French Outermost Regions, Réunion Island and Mayotte, are among the most densely populated areas in Europe, while the two Overseas Countries and Territories, the French Scattered Islands and British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) are uninhabited. The Scattered Islands are composed of five islands, i.e. Tromelin, Glorioso, Juan de Nova, Bassas da India and Europa; BIOT, also called Chagos Archipelago, is formed by five atolls and 55 islands. All these territories share the same climate and are frequently hit by tropical cyclones. From 2015 to 2023, BEST programmes supported 25 projects in this region worth more than €1.6 million.

## **ABOUT BEST**

The <u>BEST initiative</u> started as a follow-up to the '<u>Message from Réunion Island</u>', which called for a dedicated funding mechanism to support the conservation of EU Overseas' biodiversity. The <u>BEST Preparatory Action</u>, adopted by the <u>European Parliament in 2010 (BEST PA)</u>, provided seed money to fund 16 projects via two calls for project proposals known as <u>BEST I-2011</u> and <u>BEST II-2012</u>. The work enabled through the BEST PA stimulated further investment in the EU Overseas through <u>BEST RUP</u>, in the French Outermost Regions (ORs) and <u>BEST 2.0</u>, in the Overseas Countries and Territories<sup>2</sup> (OCTs). In 2019-2020, LIFE4BEST and BEST 2.0+ followed the end of BEST RUP and BEST 2.0 respectively, supporting 40 projects in the ORs and 23 in the OCTs. Both programmes support field actions that aim to enable, empower and strengthen local authorities and civil society organisations committed to local development, biodiversity conservation and sustainable use of ecosystem services.
