





BEST IN THE PACIFIC

STRENGTHENING LOCAL CONSERVATION

From 2015 to 2019, the BEST 2.0 (Voluntary Scheme for Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services in Territories of European Overseas) programme supported field actions to empower and strengthen local stakeholders committed to local development, biodiversity conservation and sustainable use of ecosystem services. 24 projects, worth over € 2.8 million, were supported by BEST 2.0 in the Pacific.

The Pacific region brings together four Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs) - New Caledonia, Wallis and Futuna, French Polynesia, and the Pitcairn Islands - spread over 150 islands and more than 20% of atolls in the world. It is the second-largest European Overseas region, and its biodiversity is threatened by habitat destruction, invasive species, economic activities, and climate change.





PROJECT RESULTS

CONSERVATION OF
BIODIVERSITY, SUSTAINABLE
USE OF ECOSYSTEM SERVICES,
CLIMATE CHANGE

88% of the projects from 2015 to 2019 were dedicated to the conservation of biodiversity and ecosystem services.



- BEST projects contributed to enhanced conservation measures in 28,000 km2 of marine and coastal areas.
- Actions towards terrestrial Invasive Alien Species were carried out in 30 km2.



- The inventory of over 900 species was updated.
- 20 new species were assessed, including
- 1 new species described for the first time, *Polyipnus laruei* in New Caledonia.
- 33 endangered species benefited from protection measures, 97% being endemic.



• 38% of projects contributed to climate change mitigation or adaptation.

PROJECT RESULTS

CAPACITY BUILDING, SUSTAINABILITY, AND VISIBILITY



- Over 600 people were involved in project implementation.
- 81 people directly employed thanks to the BEST grants.
- Around 300 education and awareness-building events were organised.
- 786 individuals were trained.



- Projects resulted in over
 100 publications of which
 42% are scientific or
 academic reports.
- More than 400
 interventions and
 mentions in media and
 social networks for BEST
 grantees.



- 272 collaborations were initiated or strengthened at the local, regional, and international level.
- 3 projects led to the adoption of new policy and legislative acts in New Caledonia and Wallis & Futuna.
- All projects could mobilise additional funding to continue part of their activities once the BEST grants were completed.

ABOUT BEST

BEST 2.0 is a programme financed by the European Commission (EC) – DG DEVCO, which continues the EU BEST Initiative as part of <u>Biodiversity4Life</u>.

Since 2011 the BEST Initiative has supported the conservation of biodiversity and sustainable use of ecosystem services, including ecosystem-based approaches to climate change adaptation and mitigation, in the 9 EU Outermost Regions (ORs), and 25 Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs), through more than 100 projects.

The IUCN French Committee was a partner to BEST 2.0 for the Pacific region.
